We all know that medicine has the power to cure and humankindness holds the power to heal, but your generosity and belief in the value of good health are what have the power to make an impact on the strength of our community.



COMPLETED PROJECTS

GEORGE HOAG FAMILY ADVANCED HYBRID SURGICAL SUITE

Opened in May 2014, this new cardiac hybrid surgical suite allows cardiologists, interventional radiologists and surgeons to perform procedures on the same patient without transferring to a second operating room or scheduling a second visit. Patients spend less time in the hospital, face fewer risks and recover quickly. See page 8 for information on the opening of the suite.

INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

A complete remodel of our Intensive Care Unit (ICU) has created a brighter, more comfortable and spacious place to promote healing for critical patients.

OUTPATIENT SUITE

A new prep and recovery suite helps expedite patient treatment, with more space, greater privacy, and better access to visitors, resulting in less waiting and a faster route to recovery for patients.

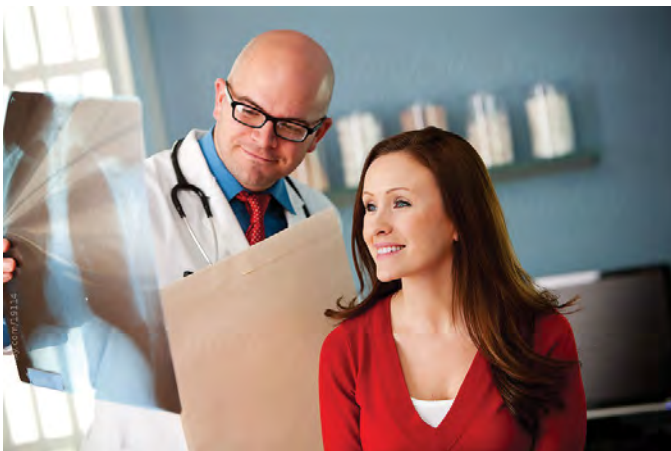
BUILDING PROGRESS

LABOR OF LOVE

The birth of a child is one of life’s most incredible experiences and, thanks to a wonderfully caring staff, our Family Birthing Center is known for providing an exceptional birthing experience, reflected in our accreditation as a Baby-Friendly hospital by Baby-Friendly USA. To match the quality of our staff and care, a complete remodel and expansion of the Family Birthing Center will update our facilities to add private patient rooms that allow for labor, delivery, recovery and post-partum all in one relaxing space. A new C-section suite will be added to the Family Birthing Center so that in instances when a C-section is needed, laboring mothers will no longer be transported across the hospital to a regular operating room, allowing for families to rest easy knowing that mom is being treated by excellent staff in the new C-section suite just steps away.



SPECIALTY PATIENT CARE WING

FHMC has long been ranked a top provider of orthopedic care. In order to best provide for our orthopedic patients, we are repurposing an existing wing of the hospital that currently houses materials management and offices to create a new 14-bed specialty patient wing. This modern wing will include a physical therapy gym and other special features to best provide for excellent orthopedic care.

THE COMMUNITY’S HOSPITAL

FHMC is truly a community hospital – we rely on the community just as much as the community relies on us. And, as a not-for-profit hospital, our mission is not driven by profit. Instead, we are driven by the single purpose of serving others.

NEW HYBRID SURGICAL SUITE BRINGS WORLD CLASS TECHNOLOGY TO THE CENTRAL COAST

Thanks to generous community support, French Hospital Medical Center is now home to the Central Coast's first and only cardiac hybrid surgical suite, a unique space where interventional radiologists, cardiologists and cardiovascular surgeons can work side-by-side in the same room, at the same time.

Located in the Copeland, Forbes & Rossi Cardiac Care Center at FHMC, the George Hoag Family Advanced Hybrid Surgical Suite brings tomorrow's technology to the Central Coast today by delivering the latest in high-tech imaging, computer and diagnostic equipment, and newly developed surgical capabilities to a traditional cardiovascular catheterization lab.

"The new hybrid suite is a monumental step forward in the delivery of health care services and has ushered in a new era of medical care for our community," said Dr. James Malone, Vice President of Medical Affairs at FHMC. "This special room allows our physicians to work with the highest degree of collaboration needed to care for unique medical problems that in the past could only be dealt with at an academic center. We are thrilled to have such advanced technology available locally for our patients."

Celebrating the opening of the suite on April 30, 2014, donors and community members were invited on special tours of the suite with presentations by several cardiologists and interventional radiologists, allowing a truly special glimpse at a surgical suite that will provide our community with advanced health care for years to come.

SUCCESSFUL HEART SURGERY PROMPTS GENEROUS DONATION

Longtime San Luis Obispo residents Sammy and Michael Pineau experienced the importance of advanced medical technology when Michael was suddenly faced with life-threatening heart complications. After their experience at French Hospital Medical Center (FHMC), they made the decision to ensure the same care would always be available to others.

It started with Michael experiencing shortness of breath. Although he is described by his wife, Sammy, as being “fit as a fiddle”, Michael also faces a family history of heart disease. Knowing this, Michael visited Dr. Stephen Hilty, who immediately referred him to FHMC cardiologist Dr. Michael Famularo and was shocked to discover Michael’s problem was due to at least 90 percent blockage in seven of his coronary arteries.

Knowing that Michael would have to undergo heart surgery, the Pineaus turned to FHMC. During their visit to the hospital for his diagnostic EKG test, the couple was directed to the Copeland, Forbes and Rossi Cardiac Care Center. Seeing those names in huge letters in the hallway made Sammy realize that the treatment her husband would receive was a result of someone else’s generosity.

“It was inspiring to see that people are contributing to things you’ve never given consideration to,” says Sammy. Very shortly thereafter, Michael successfully completed heart surgery and was released from the hospital in less than three days, thanks to the expertise of FHMC surgeon Dr. Luke Faber and team of FHMC staff. Soon after, they made a donation to FHMC to honor Dr. Luke Faber.

“I’m so thankful for our French Hospital experience,” says Sammy. “People might think they have to go to San Francisco or Los Angeles to be treated, but there is excellent state-of-the-art care here locally, and that’s what I want people to know.”

As a result of their gratefulness and after being told of the plans for the new Advanced Hybrid Surgical Suite, which is located in the Copeland, Forbes and Rossi Cardiac Care Center, the Pineaus made an additional generous contribution in support of the project to the “French – Well into the Future” campaign.

“We value quality health care in our community, and we want to help ensure that the health care we experienced will always be available to others,” says Sammy. The couple hopes that their donation will inspire others to give, so that when the time comes and there is an urgent need for something, it is already available.

CAL POLY STUDENT SPEARHEADS 'VOLUNTEEN' PROGRAM

A NEW GENERATION OF VOLUNTEERS GIVES BACK

Jessica Thoma is not your average Cal Poly student. As a fourth-year architecture major, Jessica has enough to keep her busy, yet she somehow still finds time to lead the French Hospital Medical Center's (FHMC) Volunteen Program. In doing so, she has made an incredible difference in the lives of patients, hospital staff, and local teenagers.

No stranger to the hospital, Jessica's own mother was diagnosed with cancer several years ago. After many nights at FHMC and a hard fought battle, her mother passed away in 2012.

The experience brought Jessica and her father Bill Thoma, a FHMC Foundation Board Member, closer together. So when Jessica was looking for somewhere to donate her time, it made sense to give back to the hospital that was already part of her family's history. She accepted the challenge and joined the Volunteen Program in September 2013.

"Honestly, I think this was a good fit. I really like helping people, and interacting with people is just really rewarding," Jessica said.

Her role as the Volunteen Program Coordinator makes her responsible for managing as many as 20 teens, who take turns volunteering in the evenings Monday through Thursday. With some of them stationed at the front desk, and others running errands throughout the hospital, they do everything from answering incoming phone calls to

assisting hospital staff by keeping certain areas clean and restocking supplies.

"It's a volunteer position, but really more of a job, because the hospital relies so much on us," Jessica said, reflecting on the Volunteen role.

"We're the first people that patients and their loved ones see when they walk in and the last people they see when they leave."

To date, many Volunteens commute to participate, from as far as Atascadero and Arroyo Grande. Jessica says most of the participants are interested in pursuing medical careers and see this as a way to gain an understanding of what it means to work in a health care environment.

Jessica, who grew up dancing and taught dance herself, feels that her history of leadership has prepared her for this role of managing and instructing others. The position has also made her reconsider her future. Even though she is only a year away from an architecture degree, she is now considering a career in nursing.

"I love watching the teens learn and interact with people, and giving them an experience that they might not have otherwise," Jessica added.

Although Jessica's plans after graduation are unclear, her history of serving others and her success as a leader and role model guarantees a promising future wherever she goes.

HOW THE HEARST CANCER RESOURCE CENTER AND GENEROUS DONORS TOUCHED ONE PATIENT'S LIFE

While a breast cancer diagnosis can be devastating, the thought of watching a second family member receive the same diagnosis is almost unbearable. For one mother and her daughter, the Hearst Cancer Resource Center (HCRC) at French Hospital Medical Center (FHMC) became a life-saving resource.

Kathleen Mendivil was diagnosed with breast cancer in August 2010. She remained strong through treatments, but just when her family thought they had won the battle, more news came that would turn their world upside down. In June 2013, less than three years after her mother's diagnosis, Vanessa Mendivil was diagnosed with an even more dangerous form of breast cancer. Kathleen was quick to get Vanessa involved in the HCRC, since she herself had become familiar with the center's programs after her oncologist recommended it during her own treatments.

Since 2008, the HCRC has offered support groups, therapeutic classes, and educational resources to individuals battling cancer and their families. All programs are offered at no charge and resources are available for all types of cancer.

Vanessa describes the center as a place of "ongoing, unconditional love" and was able to find some peace by participating in classes like the Energy Balancing course, where certified practitioners help promote relaxation, and Tai Chi classes, which help increase physical energy and well-being. During her own therapy, Kathleen took part in Nutritional Counseling and the Warm Yarns Knitting class.

"The community there provides a sense of unity, so you don't feel alone," Vanessa said.

"There is no way that I could have gotten through what I'm going through without the resources available at the Hearst Cancer Resource Center."

Her mother agrees in the strength of the HCRC community, saying that getting to know people and hearing their own stories helped her make it through her own cancer journey.

The Mendivil's story continued in April 2014, when the mother-daughter duo attended the Share the Hope Gala at Hearst Castle, the largest annual fundraiser for the HCRC. Also attending the event were HCRC supporters Steve and Barbara Hearst. Moved by all that Vanessa had faced, Steve and Barbara decided to make a special gift to Vanessa. During the live auction, the couple enthusiastically outbid all other bidders for a mini labradoodle puppy, a puppy which Vanessa had fallen in love with earlier in the evening. After receiving the winning bid, they gently placed the puppy in Vanessa's arms and shared words of admiration and gratitude for sharing her story. It was enough to bring everyone to tears.

Amazingly, this touching story did not end the night of Share the Hope, but continues on today. Steve and Barbara's heartfelt gesture impacted Vanessa so much that she has made the decision to train the puppy to be a therapy dog, paying forward the Hearst's gesture of kindness to others besides herself. She now also volunteers her time as a leader for one of the HCRC's many support groups, because she believes in the power of the programs at the HCRC.

Together, Vanessa and Kathleen are enthusiastic advocates for the HCRC. They know firsthand that, while the cancer journey is a physical and emotional struggle, there is a community of people who want to help and support others through it, people like Steve and Barbara Hearst.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE

HOW ONE ICU NURSE RAISED FUNDS BY RUNNING A 100-MILE RACE

Sandra Bocchicchio has gone the extra mile by raising awareness and funds for the Hearst Cancer Resource Center (HCRC) at French Hospital Medical Center (FHMC) by running a 100-mile race.

As an Intensive Care Unit (ICU) nurse at FHMC with 10 years of experience working in hospitals, Bocchicchio is surrounded by patients and families who utilize the HCRC. Since opening in 2008, the HCRC has served patients diagnosed with cancer and their families by providing them with the resources, classes and support groups they need to recover. Bocchicchio has witnessed the positive impact the center has on the community, and she was compelled to give back.

"Even if you are not affected by cancer, you know someone who has been at some point," Bocchicchio said. "I was already going to run, so why not raise money for the HCRC?"

With this realization, she began asking friends, family, and coworkers to pledge \$1 for each mile she completed during her next race. The race, known as the Indiana 100, consisted of six loops on dirt trails and required that contestants finish the nonstop 100-mile course in less than 24 hours. To train, Bocchicchio would typically run 10 miles on weekdays and 20 miles on weekends.

"It's not as hard as you think it would be," Bocchicchio said about her training. For her, running in the morning is a good way to start the day, even though she sometimes needs a headlamp when it's dark outside, depending on the time of year.

On April 25, 2014, the day before the race, Sandra felt confident. But on race-day, she woke up to news of a family emergency. With that weighing on her mind, she stopped voluntarily after running 75 miles to be with her family. Even without crossing the finish line, her efforts raised money and awareness for the HCRC.

Looking back, Bocchicchio knows she did all she could and she is proud that she could use her athletics for a good cause. She also continues running even though her next race isn't until February, when she will again tackle the Rocky Raccoon in Texas.

The mother of two children with husband Dr. Mark Bocchicchio, who is also on staff at FHMC, Sandra has a passion for running. While occasionally mixing it up by running in the company of her two Weimaraner dogs near her home in Arroyo Grande, Bocchicchio plans on giving herself more time for the fundraising process next year. She hopes to rally support from local businesses that might be interested in sponsoring her.

She knows that months of training and a finish on race day won't be easy, but if it means offering support to those battling cancer, she's willing to go the distance.

Bocchicchio is just one example of the many employees who give back to the hospital in a variety of ways. It is a true testament to the dedication of our caregivers to our patients and the community.

FHMC Employees have donated more than \$295,000 back to the hospital since 2006, through the Employee Caring Circle. In 2013–14 alone, over 150 employees donated more than \$46,000.

- **Women's Health and Imaging Center:** Providing funds to support free mammograms for the underserved.
