French Hospital Medical Center Foundation's "Share the Hope" event raises \$440,000

Surpasses previously set record for most funds raised at a FHMC Foundation event

SAN LUIS OBISPO, April 25, 2016 – The French Hospital Medical Center (FHMC) Foundation is proud to announce that its ninth annual "Share the Hope" event, held on April 9, 2016 at Hearst Ranch, raised an astounding \$440,000. This exceeds the amount raised in prior years and now holds the record for most funds raised at any FHMC Foundation event. Over the past nine years, "Share the Hope" events have raised more than \$2,050,000 to benefit the programs and services offered free of charge to cancer patients and loved ones at the Hearst Cancer Resource Center (HCRC) at FHMC.

A special call to action during the live auction raised more than \$195,000 for the HCRC's Angel of Hope Fund, which provides immediate financial assistance for basic medical needs of cancer patients and their families. A cancer diagnosis, in addition to being physically and psychologically challenging, can also have a financial impact on patients. Financial assistance through the Angel of Hope Fund enables HCRC clients to continue cancer treatments uninterrupted by helping with day-to-day expenses such as medical supplies, transportation, medical insurance, co-payments and childcare.

The HCRC collaborates with community and physician partners to provide supportive and educational services necessary for cancer patients to understand their disease, manage treatment, and maintain dignity and quality of life throughout all aspects of their cancer experience.

More than 230 guests, the most ever to attend a "Share the Hope" event, were treated to an evening that featured a champagne reception on an ocean view terrace at Hearst Castle, a gourmet dinner at the Hearst Ranch Dairy Barn, live music, as well as live and silent auctions.
